

VIII. New Business

a. Motion to Support a Proposed 5 Home Small Lot Subdivision at 20282030 Shenandoah Street (Land Use / GB081717-4)

Presentation by Jon Liberman - By right. One complaint by a nearby resident regarding privacy.

Moved by Adam. Seconded by Linda Thueng.

Board Debate: Mike Lynn expressed concerns about affordability, displacing middle class residents from the community, 5 units being added to an area without planning for parking and infrastructure.

Jon Liberman countered that the lack of city planning cannot be put on the land owners and developers.

Linda Theung – brought out the fact that we are building a negative 100,000 housing units per year in LA. We need to build in order to help the housing crisis.

Beth Hirsch countered that we need to build, but we need to encourage a balance of building that would include rental apartments. We are giving away our land to expensive small lots and luxury condos, which are pushing out the middle class in our communities.

Adam Rich and Steve Chocron feel that we should let the market decide. Not discourage development. Possibly recommend a zone change or mechanism by which we can encourage more balanced development.

Motion vote: 14-Y, 3-N, 1-A. Amended motion approved.

IX. Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 9:15pm.
