# Motion for Small Lot Development 3260-3264 Fay Ave

Applicant is asking the support of the SORO NC for a small lot development 3260-3264 Fay Ave. Los Angeles, CA 90034

# **Full Proposal**

In December 2004 the City of Los Angeles implemented the Small Lot Ordinance as a way to provide a new type of housing for Los Angeles. Small Lot Subdivision offers the following benefits to both the developer and the future buyer/owner:

- Lower liability for the developer no Home Owners' Association
- Fee simple home ownership at a lower cost
- Lower developer insurance rates vs. condo construction
- Future owners can modify the home without HOA issues
- Ability to develop feasible projects on RD 1.5, RD2, & R2 Lots. They also work on C zoned properties.

The applicant is asking for the support of the SORO NC for a four home, small lot development at 3260-3264 Fay Ave. A site plan with a hardscape plan was presented. The applicant is asking for support from SORO NC with the following requirements:

1. Setbacks. Zoning Administrators Adjustments to allow for various code requirements in the RD1.5 zone. A) A reduced front yard of 9 feet in lieu of the 15 feet required for lots identified as 1 and 2, and of 0.16 feet in lieu of the 15 feet required for lots identified as 3,4,5 and 6; B) A reduced rear yard of 0.16 feet in lieu of the 15 feet required for lots identified as 1,2,3 and 4 and of 5 feet in lieu of 15 feet required for lots identified as 5 and 6; C) A reduced side yard of 0.16 feet in lieu of the required 4-feet for lots identified as 5 and 6; D) A reduced passageway of 0 feet in lieu of the required 10 feet and, E) A reduced separation of building of 0.3 feet in lieu of the required 10 feet.

2. Open Space. Zone variance for a reduction in open space, requesting zero square feet in lieu of the Code required amounts ranging from 100 to 175 square feet per dwelling unit.

3. On-site notification. Posting a visible sign throughout the entire construction process that will provide contact information





for a live person for neighborhood communication 24 hours a day during the construction phase.

4. Landscaping plan. Attached to this motion is a preliminary landscape rendering. This project's landscape plan will provide landscaping that will enhance the building aesthetic with native and drought friendly plants. It has always been the applicant's intention to create a project that contains an extensive and well planned planting program. The applicant has received their draft mitigated negative declaration and it requires all open areas to be attractively landscaped and maintained in accordance with a landscape plan and an automatic irrigation plan.

### **Proposed Motion**

I. The LUED committee did not take a position on the project as there were issues that needed to be addressed. The committee decided to refer the issue to the General Board once the applicant responded to the issues and developed a solution and provided documentation to support the solution.

Dear Mayor and City Councilmembers:

On behalf of the South Robertson Neighborhoods Council, the below motion was passed by our Board of Directors at our regularly scheduled general board meeting.

In the past few years, the City, in alleged violation of Charter Section 911, has cut the budgets of both the Neighborhood Councils, as well as the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment, to the point that the cuts have materially impaired the ability of the department to perform its mandated functions. With the proposal to have the individual Neighborhood Councils fund their elections through a funding cut, this too shall materially impair the local Neighborhood Councils from performing those functions that the community has come to rely on.

#### Motion

Whereas the City is asking the Neighborhood Councils to postpone their elections due to budget issues, and

Whereas the City is asking each neighborhood council to pay for their next elections, approximately \$7300.00 per council, and


Whereas the City continues to violate Charter Section 911 by cutting neighborhood council funds, sweeping annual excess funds, and failing to fund Neighborhood Councils in a secure account one year in advance,

Therefore, the South Robertson Neighborhoods Council moves:

Dear Mayor Villaraigosa:

My Office has been contacted by the Neighborhood Council Budget Advocates, who understand that the Mayor's budget proposal for the 2013/14 fiscal year will again recommend a reduction in the allocation to neighborhood councils. Specifically, I have been advised that the proposed annual allocation to each neighborhood council may be reduced, and that from this annual sum, each neighborhood council will be required to pay for the costs to conduct its neighborhood council elections. In short, this means that there will be a significant decline in the amount of funds provided to each neighborhood council in order to conduct their very important and essential affairs. Moreover, the possible new cuts to the neighborhood council budgets will come at a time when the City's overall financial health, based on all economic indicators, is improving.

I am writing to urge you to provide full funding to all neighborhood councils that will enable them to carry out their City Charter-mandated functions, including the costs of conducting their elections. As you are aware, since 2009, there have been drastic cuts to both the budget and staffing of the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment, as well as to the funds provided to the neighborhood councils. Moreover, I know that you are aware of the line of legal authority that concludes that constitutionally-required activities of government cannot be so de-funded as to materially impair and render their intended duties incapable of appropriate performance. This Office believes that neighborhood councils fall squarely within that category of government activities that should be fully funded. Mayor Villaraigosa March 13, 2013 Page 2

At this time, I understand that the Mayor's budget for fiscal year 2013/14 has yet not been finalized. As such, the concerns that have been conveyed to me by various neighborhood councils may be premature and hopefully, may not be an issue when your final budget recommendations are issued in April 2013. I simply hope and intend that this letter informs your decisions.

I am available to meet and discuss this matter at your convenience. Thank you for your consideration of my comments and concerns.

# **Proposed Motion**

- I. To oppose Amending Motion 31B, submitted January 30, 2013 to Council File 11-0262, on the following grounds:
  - a. Lack of sufficient staff support and lack of a funding mechanism,
  - b. Inability to presently enforce codes,
  - c. Anticipated 10% across the board budget cuts to all City departments slated for FY 2013-2014, and
  - d. Complete lack of transparent fiscal analysis.
- II. We further strongly oppose the continued gutting of the R1 and other lowdensity residential zones in the City of Los Angeles. The General Plan of the City of Los Angeles protects the residential character of these zones. The City is therefore required by law to prepare a General Plan Amendment and to produce a full Environmental Impact Report in compliance with CEQA to establish any ordinance adding boarding houses as a by right use into low density residential zones.

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City of Los Angeles Certified Neighborhood Council **COMMUNITY CARE FACILITY ORDINANCE MOTION.** Jennifer Malaret, Chris Spitz and George Wolfberg. Upon motion by Chris Spitz, seconded by George Wolfberg, the Council approved the following resolution:

PACIFIC PALISADES COMMUNITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION RELATED TO THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES', DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING, RECOMMENDED COMMUNITY CARE FACILITY ORDINANCE; COUNCIL FILE 11-0262; REPORT NO. R13-0014 DATED JANUARY 3, 2013 AND ALARCON-ROSENDAHL AMENDING MOTION 31B DATED JANUARY 30, 2013

Whereas, for more than six years the City of Los Angeles has deemed it necessary to update the Los Angeles Municipal Code's ("LAMC") existing definitions of *family* and *boarding/rooming houses* to provide effective tools for the City to enforce its zoning laws relative to transient shared housing operations in low-density R1 and R2 zones.

Whereas, the Pacific Palisades Community Council ("PPCC") has supported an update to the zoning code via the enactment of a well-balanced Community Care Facilities Ordinance ("CCFO"), currently evidenced by Planning's most recent Report No. R13-0014 (the "January 2013 CCFO")<sup>1</sup>. PPCC has asked for nominal protections as found in other cities that seek to maintain stable single- family neighborhoods by:

- prohibiting unlicensed and illegal boarding homes, as well as parolee/probationer facilities,
- imposing concentration and distance limits from sensitive uses, and
- public notice for larger facilities that serve seven (7) or more residents.

#### Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the Pacific Palisades Community Council:

(A) OPPOSES the Alarcon-Rosendahl- Amending Motion ("Gut the Code") because this proposed amendment would eliminate the historic prohibition of the establishment of boarding houses in low-density R1 and R2 zones by removing the definitions of "family", "parolee- probationer home," "single housekeeping unit" and "boarding or rooming house" from the zoning code. Alarcon-Rosendahl's Gut the Code Motion also eliminates the requirement for a conditional use permit for parolee-probationer homes in any residential building located in R3 or more restrictive zones. Thus, the Alarcon-Rosendahl Gut the Code Motion opens all residential areas of the Palisades<sup>2</sup> to transient boarders by allowing any R1 and R2 property owner to rent to as many persons, including paroles/probationers, as the code allows without parking requirements, and performance standards to protect neighbors and limits to protect residential blocks, schools and churches.

(B) SUPPORTS the proposed Westside Regional Alliance of Councils' ("WRAC") Motion written in opposition to the Alarcon-Rosendahl Gut the Code Motion:

We, the members of the Westside Regional Alliance of Councils, oppose Amending Motion 31B, submitted January 30, 2013 to Council File 11-0262, on the following grounds: (1) Lack of sufficient staff support and lack of a funding mechanism, (2) Inability to presently enforce codes, (3) Anticipated 10% across the board budget cuts to all City departments slated for FY 2013-2014, and (4) Complete lack of transparent fiscal analysis. We further strongly oppose the continued gutting of the R1 and other low-density residential zones in the City of Los Angeles. The General Plan of the City of Los Angeles protects the residential character of these zones. The City is therefore required by law to prepare a General Plan Amendment and to produce a full Environmental Impact Report in compliance with CEQA to establish any ordinance adding boarding houses as a by right use into low density residential zones.

#### (C) URGES THE LOS ANGELES CITY COUNCIL TO:

(1) Maintain and preserve the definitions of "family", "parolee-probationer home," "single housekeeping unit" and "boarding or rooming house" in the January 2013 CCFO;

(2) Preserve the conditional use permit requirement for Parolee-Probationer Homes as listed in the January 2013 CCFO;

(3) Maintain and preserve the Parking Requirement, Public Benefit and Performance Standards as listed in the January 2013 CCFO;

(4) Ensure that the City's zoning authorities shall have appropriate enforcement resources for all licensed and unlicensed Community Care Facilities with nuisance, parking, infrastructure overutilization and zoning problems, and that all landlords of Community Care Facilities be required to appropriately and sustainably pay into a dedicated fund to ensure all funding, manpower and other resources to perform such enforcement. (5) Provide a phase-in period of one year coupled with a reduced [or waived] fee for that year for the Directors Determination specified in LAMC 12.22 EXCEPTIONS, A. USE #27, REASONABLE ACCOMODATION to provide a path to legitimacy for existing unlicensed group homes which do not adhere to the definitions specified in (C)(1) herein but serve protected populations as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act.

(6) Include the recommendations of LAPD Chief Charlie Beck set forth in the Chief's August 14, 2012 letter to City Council [previously circulated/public document; available upon request].

# **Full Proposal**

KCET Departures, an online, interactive documentary series, spend a good portion of 2012 documenting stories of South Robertson based on an NPG grant from SORO NC. Thanks to the enthusiasm and hard work of the KCET production staff, the scope of the project grew far beyond the dollar amount we had funded at no further cost, and we were fortunate enough to end up with a robust chapter for South Robertson on their site, alongside major LA neighborhoods such as Venice, Chinatown and Highland Park.

In the research process for 2012 Production, KCET identified many more SORO Stories that they would like to tell, building out the South Robertson chapter with new and diverse materials. The interactive web-based nature of the series offers the opportunity to expand on the project seamlessly.

Early statistics for viewership in the month following the launch of the Phase 1 project were very promising: 3500 people visited the KCET SORO project between Feb 1 and Feb 25 2013, equal to the early launch numbers for Venice and Highland Park. It is expected that these numbers would continue to grow over time. The material was also posted numerous times via social media, with many thousands of additional impressions through Facebook and Twitter. SORO NC also published links to the material via our social media channels, website and email blasts.

The Outreach Committee is very excited to continue to expand on this series in partnership with KCET. We feel that the series helps accomplish many of the stated goals of SORO NC, including community building, raising the public profile of the neighborhoods, and creating outreach further into portions of our community that do not traditionally interact with the Neighborhood Council.

Accordingly, we have spoken to KCET about expanding the project into Phase 2. KCET anticipates that our dollars could reach even further in Phase 2, since much of the initial research has already been done, meaning that more time and dollars could be committed to actual production of stories.

It is important to note that the funds from the NC are the only funding source committed to this project. KCET offers their staff production time and expertise inkind, and no other sources of funding contribute to this specific South Robertson chapter of the series.

The Outreach Committee will continue to work closely with KCET to establish Phase 2 goals, and to help secure stories from our diverse communities. We will also work with KCET to conceive of creative ways to bring the stories back into our community through Outreach events like the SoRo Festival, Movies in the Park, and in partnership with schools and public spaces within our boundaries.

This grant will be used to expand the KCET DEPARTURES installment of South Robertson. KCET DEPARTURES is an ongoing collaborative media project that tells the untold stories of Los Angeles' diverse neighborhoods. Last year, KCET DEPARTURES researched, conducted interviews, and published stories about the neighborhoods, people, and businesses of South Robertson. This grant will enable us to build upon the research we've conducted so far and the relationships we've created with the communities, to realize stories that have not yet been produced.

Working in close collaboration with the neighborhood council, we plan to continue our outreach, and research (people, places, or things) to create editorial content that will add to the already produced installment of South Robertson.

Working with the neighborhood council for the first phase of the project, we interviewed a wide range of people of different cultural, social, and economic backgrounds. The next phase will be a valuable opportunity to revisit and further explore communities that have been approached previously, and to gain entry points into communities that may remain underrepresented.

In essence, this grant will allow us to reinforce the diverse neighborhoods and communities of South Robertson, and define and share SORO's distinct identity within the larger tapestry of Los Angeles.

Childhood obesity and related chronic conditions such as Type 2 diabetes are a community issue. By educating both parents and kids on the importance of a healthy lifestyle through good nutrition and physical activity we can make sure that they do not continue to rise in prevalence. Regardless of background or income there are ways for families to increase the nutritional value of what they eat and the amount of physical activity that they have in their daily routine. The families that take part in this program will not only be empowered to sustain these changes in their homes but have the knowledge to pay-it-forward to other families in the community. This creates a ripple effect of health throughout the community.




