a. Presentation and possible motion by Judy Goldman, Keep Neighbors First campaign.

Motion: Whereas, short-term rentals are currently prohibited in R1 (single-family), R2, RD, R3 (lower-density multi-family residential) and RAS3 (residential accessory services) zones in the City of Los Angeles;

Whereas, the unregulated transient commercial use of residential property negatively affects the essential character and stability of our neighborhoods:

Whereas, short-term rental abuse in residential areas threatens the supply of longer-term housing and affordable housing in Los Angeles; and

Whereas, the unregulated practice of short-term rentals poses public safety hazards for hosts, guests and neighbors; and





Whereas, the City is currently reviewing the prohibitions on short-term rentals:

Therefore, be it resolved, the Board of the South Robertson Neighborhoods Council:

Supports the Keep Neighborhoods First Campaign at it reaches out to other Neighborhood Councils concerned about the impact of commercialized short-term rental abuse.

Urges the City Administrative Officer to compile and provide the following information and financial analysis so that the City has the information necessary to fully evaluate the impact of the legalization of short-term rentals in residential areas: the current number of short- term rentals in residential zones throughout the City; the number of listings, whether registered or unregistered properties, that fall under the Rent Stabilization Ordinance; projections on the amount of tax revenue that would be raised; and the costs of regulation and enforcement.

Requests that Mayor Eric Garcetti, members of the Los Angeles City Council, City Attorney Mike Feuer, the Los Angeles Department of Housing and the Department of Building & Safety take steps to immediately ensure the enforcement of current zoning ordinances and building occupancy regulations that prohibit short-term rentals in residential neighborhoods.

- Discussion and possible motion to oppose development of a parking lot into Senior Housing 8612 W Pico BI Los Angeles, California 90035 without increasing parking spaces from 41 to 100 for the commercial corridor.
- Discussion and possible motion for the LUED to become members of the Westside Urban Forum
