The project extends light rail service from the Phase 1 terminus in Culver City to 4th Street and Colorado Avenue in Santa Monica utilizing the Exposition Right-of-way and Colorado Avenue.

Phase 2 of the Expo Light Rail Line will:

- Provide a high capacity, cost-effective mass transit alternative to driving on the congested I-10 freeway
- Generate design, professional services and construction jobs beginning in 2010
- Provide enhanced access to major activity centers, including linkages to Downtown Los Angeles, Culver City and Santa Monica
- Provide improved connectivity to the regional transit system which serves all of Los Angeles County
- Realize environmental benefits associated with mass transit usage, including air quality and energy efficiencies

Many changes have been included in the FEIR in response to stakeholder, agency and community comments to the Draft EIR released in early 2009. They include:

- A design option that removes the park-and-ride lot at the Westwood station
- A Maintenance Facility design option which includes Santa Monica College and Verizon properties and has a 100-110 foot buffer along the Verizon property, providing additional protection to the residential community to the south of the proposed facility
- Accommodation of a continuous bikeway from the Phase 1 terminus to Santa Monica
- An additional grade separation at Centinela
- A third northbound lane on Sepulveda for the at-grade crossing
- A design option for a grade separation at Sepulveda if funding becomes available

Your support at the February 4th meeting will help ensure that your Measure R dollars are put to work as soon as possible.
