The South Robertson Neighborhoods Council is vitally interested in obtaining city services for the unhoused in our community. We have observed that there are designated city approved service providers authorized to function within designated boundaries for specified services only. Our challenge is that we learn of these providers only in conjunction with the services previously provided to unhoused neighborhood council stakeholders. This results in service providers applying a one size fits all model to our unhoused stakeholders, leading to individuals receiving delayed, ineffective, or incorrect services.

The South Robertson Neighborhoods Council hereby requests that there be an active ongoing and updated list available on your website at all times that details service providers, the areas they cover, and the services they provide for all stakeholders in every area throughout Los Angeles.

Please forward a copy of this list to us within the next 30 days and provide that list to all neighborhood councils.

Background

The Ballona Creek Bike Path runs from the ocean to Syd Kronenthal Park, where it connects to the Expo Line Bike Path. The Bike path was originally intended to go past Syd Kronenthal Park to the actual terminus of the creek at Cochran & Venice Blvd two miles away, but the second phase of the project was never completed. The extension would significantly increase access to the bike path for residents of Mid City and offers improved interconnectedness to South Robertson residents and workers who will use the Purple Line and who currently use the Expo Line..

Dear Supervisor Mitchell,

South Robertson Neighborhoods Council is in support of the initiative to extend the Ballona Creek bike path from its current terminus at Syd Kronenthal Park in Culver City to Venice & Cochran.

Culver City is a large jobs center, but lacks enough housing for everyone that works there. By extending the bike path, people that work East and North of Culver City would have a car-free option to get to/from work without having to take on the sometimes intimidating Venice Blvd bike lane. This would also benefit people with jobs further west, such as Venice, Santa Monica, and Playa Vista.

Currently, the frontage roads by Ballona Creek east of La Cienega Blvd are unimproved, roped off unused patches of land that don't serve anyone well. A bike path with drought resistant plants, solar powered lighting, and appropriate street furniture would be a huge improvement for the space.

Lastly, during the pandemic, bicycle purchases skyrocketed as people spent more time closer to their homes -- the demand for alternatives to driving is powerful. This bike path would serve a major east-west corridor and would provide a clean, active, non-car transportation option for people. Additionally, it closes the first and last mile gap for residents of South Robertson who wish to use the Expo Line.

Background

Los Angeles is the largest urban oil fiend in the country with more than 5,000 active and idle oil wells next door to homes, schools, parks, daycares, hospitals, eldercare facilities, places of worship, and other sensitive areas. More than 500,000 people in Los Angeles live within half a mile of an active oil well. Other cities have stringent protections to keep people away from oil wells because research has shown that living near a site causes asthma, cancer, and premature death. Residents living near these sites have complained to city council for decades about toxic spills, exposure to carcinogens, and a lack of regulation. The emissions released from LA's oil wells are equivalent to that emitted by 11 coal plants or nearly 10,000,000 cars. South Robertson contains several oil wells and is in proximity to major sites such as the Inglewood Oil Field. City Council is considering the motion in 17-0447 which would propel the city towards a phase-out of oil and gas drilling by declaring drilling a nonconforming land use. The City Attorney released an analysis outlining why the phaseout plan is sufficient and would have zero impact on the city budget...

Proposed Motion

Submit a CIS in support of Council File 17-0447:

As the City Attorney has recently submitted his legal analysis to the Council, we the South Robertson Neighborhoods Council urge the City Council to protect our communities in Los Angeles from the harmful health impacts of oil drilling, recognizing that the BIPOC communities are often most affected. Out of the 1.8 million Californians living near drilling in heavily polluted areas, 92% are from communities of color. We are also aware of homes being built on top of capped oil wells, another unsafe practice that should be prohibited. Mayor Garcetti's Green New Deal includes reducing oil drilling and creating a buffer zone between oil and gas facilities and communities. As of August 2018, Council District 5 has 58 Onshore Oil Districts out of the 330 in the City of L.A. Right here in South Robertson, we have a massive oil well site on Pico Blvd. We insist that protecting our neighbors and our environment become a priority over oil drilling both onshore and offshore. We encourage the City Council to approve this motion and to write a resolution in favor of AB-345. Additionally, we want the city to enforce all existing regulations on neighborhood oil drilling to keep communities safe, including timely inspections.

Background

In March 2021, Metro staff recommended five corridors for future Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) lines, including LaCienega Boulevard between Culver City and West Hollywood - a north-south route between Santa Monica Boulevard and Slauson Avenue that would connect the Purple, Expo, and future LAX lines.

A single standard 60 foot bus has the capacity to move 100 people in one vehicle, alleviating traffic significantly owing to the fact that it takes 99 vehicles off the road. A lane of passenger cars can carry around 3,000 passengers per hour, while buses have the capacity to carry 16,000-25,000 people per hour depending on headways. BRT has even higher capacity because it uses a dedicated lane. A Bus Rapid Transit line along LaCienega would significantly alleviate traffic, pollution, and parking woes, plus make public transportation much more efficient in the South Robertson area, guaranteeing connections to Downtown LA, LAX, Hollywood, Koreatown, and the Valley that are much faster than driving.

We, the South Robertson Neighborhoods Council, support efforts to install BRT on LaCienega Blvd, a major bus corridor. BRT on this section of LaCienega would allow for fast and convenient access between the Expo Line and future Purple Line stations, incentivizing residents to use public transportation.

Background

Due to the pandemic students, teachers and staff have been under enormous pressure to sustain any semblance of an educational process that produces the environment where the required core instructional materials can be presented, taught, and retained by the students. Of the four public schools within our boundaries this is the only one that does not have a significant parent/booster base that can augment LAUSD funding. In the past this neighborhood council has responded to requests from this school for funding. Here they are asking for a minimal amount to recognize the efforts of teachers and staff to spend this past year in pioneering a remote teaching environment over the internet. (\$500). In addition to acknowledge the achievements of their graduating class of 60 fifth graders they have asked us to provide them with backpacks and supplies at a cost of \$20 per graduate. (\$1200)

SOVA's pantries provide free healthy groceries, access to community resources including legal assistance and public benefits enrollments, information and referrals to other safety net services in the community and counseling by onsite social workers. Operating for the past 35 years, SOVA is committed to providing a safety net for individuals and families who struggle with the hardship of living in poverty.

SOVA responds to hunger and poverty in our community by providing individuals and families with immediate relief of hunger and food insecurity along with the resources they need to begin to regain self-sufficiency and independence. People living in poverty rarely have access to or cannot afford healthy and nutritious food. Many households are one job loss or medical crisis away from food insecurity. Even before the pandemic, one in ten working adults in the US lived in a home that could not afford enough food to adequately feed ther families.
