Full Proposal

For the past several years SORO NC has funded a program between Hamilton High School (HHS) and local businesses called Safe Passages. The concept was for local business owners to have an ability to directly communicate with HHS Security in the event of H.H.S. students creating a nuisance in the local businesses during School hours. As part of the program, HHS security officers were provided with (#?) of Sprint/Nextel telephones. Sprint has notified us that the Nextel Direct Connect network will no longer function after June 30, 2013.

After consulting with local businesses the SORO NC Public Safety Committee (PSC) has found the program falls short of it's intended purpose due in part to the following reasons:

- Many of the businesses have never heard of the program.
- The few that did know found the response inadequate.

Due to the continuing reduction (and possible future reductions) to the SORO NC budget, the PSC believes that the Safe passage program funding can be better allocated elsewhere.

Proposed Motion

To discontinue funding of the Hamilton High School Safe Passages Program as of June 30th 2013 and to send a letter to Hamilton High School Administration notifying them of the termination and requesting the recovery of all SORO NC provided equipment.

4) - Please describe the Neighborhood Improvement Project for which the grant is intended.

Fresh Fruit on Fridays is a farm to school nutrition program that provides Title 1 elementary school children with a weekly tutorial of the benefits of eating fresh fruits and vegetables by sampling farm fresh produce brought to their school by way of farmers participating at the La Cienega Farmers' Market. Each week children get to sample a different variety of seasonal fruits or vegetables and learn about the farmer, growing and historical information, as well as nutritional benefits. This 11 year old prgram has proven time after time that when students are amongst their peers they are more apt to try new foods that they may otherwise be resistant to eating at or away from home.

5) How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a non-discriminatory, public purpose and benefit the public at-large.

This grant will serve each student of Shenandoah Avenue Elementary farm fresh produce for 9 weeks in the spring semester and 10 in the fall begining in March of 2013 and ending in December of 2013. The entire grant amount will be used to purchase produce from farmers at the La Cienega Farmers' Market and all administration and labor costs will be paid for by the sponsoring non-profit organization, the Model Neghborhood Program. Many of these children are members of a segment of population experiencing large numbers of Type 2 childhood diabietes, with eating habits that are related to this medical condition. Fresh Fruit on Fridays offers an alternative with the introduction of farm fresh fruit and vegetables, served at their peak season when flavors are at their best.



Full Proposal

Whereas, in 2006 the City of Los Angeles entered into agreements with Clear Channel Outdoor and CBS Outdoor allowing them to convert up to 800 static billboards to digital in exchange for the removal of significantly less billboards;

And whereas, the agreement was entered into without public hearing, public comment, or any input from neighborhood councils, community groups or resident organizations;

And whereas, the agreement resulted in Clear Channel and CBS erecting over 100 illegal digital billboards throughout the City of Los Angeles;

And whereas, these 100 plus digital billboards were placed without input from affected neighborhood residents and/or stakeholders and have subsequently diminished quality of life;

And whereas, a lawsuit, known as *Summit Media LLC v. City of Los Angeles, was* filed challenging the legality of the settlement agreement despite such billboards being prohibited by the City's zoning code;

And whereas, both a Los Angeles Superior Court Judge and a three member California Appeals Court panel ruled the settlement agreement illegal and the 100 plus signs illegal and in violation of the existing City sign law;

And whereas, the Court of Appeals ruled the permits granted under the settlement agreement are illegal and thus the signs must be removed;

And whereas, the existing City law clearly makes these 100 plus digital signs illegal;

And whereas, the two billboard companies have dispatched an army of lawyers and lobbyists to get the City Council to change the existing law to circumvent the court ruling and retroactively "legalize" these digital billboards;

And whereas, the efforts to circumvent the law silences residents, community leaders, neighborhood councils from involvement in the process of policy development, violates due process for stakeholder input, and clearly ignores the accepted practice of undertaking an environmental review under CEQA;

Proposed Motion

- I. THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, South Robertson Neighborhoods Council urges the City of Los Angeles to fully implement the Court ruling and remove the illegal digital billboards;
- II. AND FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, South Robertson Neighborhoods Council opposes any efforts by the City of Los Angeles to initiate any changes to the zoning laws relative to digital billboards without a full and open public process inclusive of robust public input.
