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

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Motion to fund an NPG for Hami Gardens in an amount of up to \$1055.62 for equipment, supplies and seed

Background

Since 2009 this neighborhood council has supported Hami Gardens with funding for various community improvements. Hami Gardens is located on the grounds of Alexander Hamilton High School. It was originally started with a City of Los Angeles Beautification Grant and with money provided by this neighborhood council. The gardens are open to students and to the community. Since that start Hami Gardens has grown to become a vital part of campus and community life for those interested in gardening, food production, environment, weather, biology, botany, sustainability, cooking, and social responsibility.

The garden is open afterschool on Tuesday and Saturday mornings to both students and the community. Produce grown in the garden is shared by the students, neighbors and with the SOVA Food Pantry.

The garden has been used by various Hamilton High School classes, student clubs, afterschool programs, local elementary schools, student independent studies, Eagle Scout Troops and gardening classes conducted by the Hami Garden's Master Gardener-in-residence. In the garden, the students have studied everything from organic pest repellents to the shrinking population of Monarch butterflies, giving the students and community a greater understanding of issues facing both farmers, the environment, and the declining habitat of migratory butterflies.

During the early days of the pandemic, the gardens were closed to students. The gardens were maintained by community volunteers during this period. The garden was kept open and growing food because of the need for produce by the SOVA Food Pantry. During the pandemic, the Gardens contributed over 800 lbs. of produce to the food pantry. The gardens are now open to students with the recent LAUSD reopening of the campus to on site learning.

This request was originally approved last fiscal year by this board but went unfunded when the year closed and funds became unavailable. It has been revised upward from \$665.74 to \$1055.62 due to: (a) additional tools being needed, (b) prices have increased since the last submission of the NPG, and (c) seed is needed for two planting seasons.

Proposed Motion

The South Robertson Neighborhoods Council as part of its Neighborhood Purpose Grant program will fund up to \$1055.62 to purchase the requested equipment, supplies and seed for the Hami Gardens, with \$700 being transferred from the Elections Budget item to the NPG Budget item.

SECTION II- PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Section II- (4) Purpose/intent of the grant.

The Hami Garden was established in 2010 on the campus of Hamilton High School with a generous Community Beautification Grant. It has been governed by Paula Waxman, the Community Garden Manager since inception, and resident Master Gardener, George Pessin, who has helped the students and community maintain the garden by donating his expertise and educating the students and community in horticulture and backyard vegetable gardening.

The students are about to begin the spring planting. We have not asked for a grant from the Neighborhoods Council in several years using money raised by the students through the sale of plants and collecting and recycling plastic bottles and cans. The current NPG request is intended to replace garden equipment that has worn out or has simply been used up (twine, tape to repair irrigation tubing). Also, as more students want to work in the garden, we have need for more tools, gloves, etc. This grant would also be used to purchase seed for the winter planting season as well. And finally, our shed was vandalized over the pandemic. Our first aid kit and a large dust pan were stolen. A wonderful community member volunteered his time to repair the shed door, which was pried open.

Section II- (5) How will this grant be used to support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public at large?

Without the generous support of our Neighborhood Council, the Hami Garden would not be able to continue its work feeding and educating the students on campus and volunteers from the community. We also would not be able to continue to donate produce to SOVA, the food bank that serves food insecure students, their families, and members of the SORONC community. The food grown on campus is first distributed to student volunteers, next community volunteers, and finally the SOVA food bank on Pico and Robertson. During the pandemic, we donated over 600 pounds of produce to the SOVA food bank.

Regarding education, high school students study organic farming practices, such as organic pest repellents (not pesticides which kill pollinators), hybridization, entomology, how to address broader issues such as declining habitats, global warming and water conservation. Part of the garden is dedicated to dealing with the decline in the monarch population by providing the pollinators with the milkweed that is their only food source. Another part of the garden is devoted to drought tolerant, and native plants.

Each year, we select two student garden managers who act as liaison between the garden, the school administration, and the students. They are responsible for securing student volunteers and depending upon their interests, starting garden/vegetarian/environmental clubs on campus. And, during school months, they also can get instruction in grant writing.

We have hosted students from Hamilton's UCLA Afterschool Program, from the Special Education Department, and from Shenandoah Elementary School. The Shenandoah class also combined the visit with a poetry writing assignment by high school students.

Periodically our Master Gardener offers to the community a basic class on how to begin a backyard garden.

We get grants as needed from:

Kellogg Garden Supplies: They supply all soil amendment needs such as fertilizers and mulch. Our needs vary from year to year. Sometimes we have several years with no need. But they are always there to help us. So I can only give you an estimate. Their donations vary from several hundred dollars up to \$600/year.

DIG Corporation: They donated a replacement for their irrigation timer when ours failed. They have also replaced damaged irrigation line at no cost. I do not know the value of the timer or line.

Student Fundraisers: The students sell plants and succulents and also raise funds from recycling aluminum cans and plastic bottles. We share these funds with the Environmental Club and the Giving Club. This is a new idea but should raise about \$150 a year.
