Background

The <u>LA Now program</u> is a shared-ride pilot service run by LA DOT that provides an on-demand shuttle that, for a nominal fee, picks up transit riders within the boundaries of the program and will drop them off anywhere else within the boundaries of the program. It is intended as a "last mile" solution to help riders get from within their neighborhood to a major transit hub.

LA Now currently services an area spanning from Venice to the edge of the SORO boundaries, at Robertson and National. Because the program does not extend into the SORO boundaries, if a SORO resident or visitor requests a ride, even if they are one block outside the LA Now boundaries, they will not be picked up by the service.

SORO is accessible to several major transit hubs within its boundaries and on its edges. This includes the La Cienega transit corridor, and the Culver City and Palms stations of the Expo line. The addition of the Purple line extension nearby will increase these adjacent hubs.

A trial expansion into SORO would potentially provide more access to these transit hubs. Additionally, a trial expansion would allow the City to test if it is a sufficiently used service in SORO to justify the costs of running the service in SORO.

It is intended as a "last mile" solution to help riders get from within their neighborhood to a major transit hub.

LA Now currently services an area spanning from Venice to the edge of the SORO boundaries, at Robertson and National. Because the program does not extend into the SORO boundaries, if a SORO resident or visitor requests a ride, even if they are one block outside the LA Now boundaries, they will not be picked up by the service.

However, SORO is accessible to several major transit hubs within its boundaries and on its edges. This includes the La Cienega transit corridor, and the Culver City and Palms stations of the Expo line. The addition of the Purple line extension nearby will increase these adjacent hubs. Providing SORO residents with a fast, affordable method for accessing these major transportation hubs is vital to the City's future transportation planning.

A trial expansion into SORO would potentially provide more access to these transit hubs. Additionally, a trial expansion would allow the City to test if it is a sufficiently used service in SORO to justify the costs of running the service in SORO.

Background

The Applicant & Owner Robertson Cashio, LLC of 1502 Robertson Blvd has proposed the construction, use & maintenance of a new 2-story 19,921sf 40-room Memory Care Facility for Alzheimer's / Dementia care. The proposed height is 44'-8" and there will be one level of subterranean level with space for 15 vehicles and 9 bicycles along with a preparation Kitchen. The entire development is "By-Right" and under the allowable heights and density for the location. The Site's current use is a gas station.

During the Planning review the Applicant became aware there was a Mobility Plan stipulation to allow for widening Cashio St in the future which required a 3ft street dedication. The Applicant is complying with the Street Dedication. The proposed building layout on Cashio St. varies to create interest on the facade and side landscaping. Due to the dedication the proposed Memory Care Facility needs to request a Zoning Administrator's Adjustment to allow (adjust) the side yard to let it be 0- to 5 feet in lieu of the otherwise required 5 feet along Cashio Street.


