



## Background:

The Neighborhood Council System was founded in 1999 to promote more citizen participation in government and make government more responsive to local needs, a citywide system of neighborhood councils, and a Department of Neighborhood Empowerment was created. The Neighborhood Councils are governed by the Charter (https://codelibrary.amlegal.com/codes/los\_angeles/latest/laac/0-0-0-

<u>3743#JD\_Ch900</u>) , their By-laws

and state law. Over the years, the city has tried to subject Neighborhood Council Boardmembers to undue influence or control by city officials and agencies. The Neighborhood Council Boardmembers are elected officials that represent the Stakeholders that elected them. This is the Declaration of Neighborhood Council Rights:

#### **Declaration of Neighborhood Council Rights**

Whereas, the people of the City of Los Angeles enacted, in the charter of 1999, a system of Neighborhood Councils, whose missions are "to promote more citizen participation in government and make government more responsive to local needs" and,

Whereas, in order to fulfill these missions, Neighborhood Councils must be empowered to operate as independently as possible of the city's officials and agencies and not subject to undue influence or control by those officials and agencies,

Therefore, the Neighborhood Councils of the City of Los Angeles declare:

Neighborhood Councils' Boardmembers are elected officials of the City of Los Angeles.

The method by which Boardmembers are chosen shall be determined solely by the Bylaws of each Council.





The sole authority to censure, suspend, remove, or otherwise discipline a Boardmember is vested in the Neighborhood Council of which that individual is a Boardmember.

Each Board shall determine the composition of its Bylaws and no other agency or commission of the city, with the exception of Board composition and boundaries of the Council, may alter or amend those Bylaws following initial Council certification and approval by the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners.

No official or agency of the City of Los Angeles may delay or otherwise impede the action of a Neighborhood Council to amend its Bylaws or rules.



#### Background

Clean streets and sidewalks in our commercial areas has always been a priority for Soro NC. In past years this was a function of the Green Team Committee that was handled by Soro Stakeholders on a volunteer basis. The Green Team has not been an active committee for a number of years. Our last clean-up was in Mid 2019 when the NC paid approximately \$4800 to a commercial company to clean up Robertson Blvd from Cadillac to Cattaraugus.

Our commercial areas today need clean-up now and for periodic follow-ups. It is not economically practical to pay for continual clean ups by a commercial establishment. There is no active Green Team Committee at this time. The Business Advocacy & Development Committee feels that promoting clean, attractive streets will increase economic viability and profitability of merchants operating within the boundaries of Soro.

In December,2022 We want to the board and asked that our purview be revised to permit this committee to assist with keeping our commercial streets clean and attractive. The Board agreed. After that date we received numerous requests that some form of community clean-up on a continuing basis be considered for both commercial and residential areas within the Soro NC boundaries. There is a need for such a program, and we are at a point with our finances that we can afford to fund this with our current funding.

The Executive Committee feels that the best alternative is to expand the Budget Advocacy and Development Committee's purview to allow cleanup of all streets and sidewalks within Soro. We will also provide equipment to allow stakeholders to clean their streets on a street-by-street basis. Some of this equipment we already have through prior purchase by the Green Team. Some will have to be purchased.

#### **Proposed Motion**

That the SORO NC Board :

- 1. Amends the Business Advocacy & Development Committee purview to allow this committee to assist Soro stakeholders in keeping all of our streets clean and attractive.
- 2. Agrees that the equipment shown in Attachment A is needed to accomplish this function and agrees to authorize purchase of the equipment in an amount not to exceed \$5000 subject to the limitation that all equipment shown on Attachment A that is currently owned by Soro and in usable condition will not be purchased.
- 3. Agrees that the Business Advocacy & Development Committee can organize clean up days in areas of Soro and can make this equipment available to stakeholders who volunteer for the cleanup. These clean up days will be supervised by members of the Budget Advocacy and Development Committee.
- 4. Agrees that the Business Advocacy & Development Committee can start clean ups at the earliest possible date even if equipment is not yet available.

A tax on ammo and firearms simply would not prevent criminals and gangs from committing violent acts. At a time when crime rates are up and local district attorneys are not prosecuting many crimes, the right to self-defense by law-abiding citizens should be encouraged and not hindered.
