


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Land Use Special Committee Meeting Agenda

No individual speaker will be allowed more than two (2) minutes during General Public Comment, unless the presiding officer decides differently.

- a. Discussion and Possible Action to demolish two SFRs on two abuting lots at 1904-1906 Preuss to construct 12 townhomes.
- b. Discussion and Possible Action to demolish a one story former bank building and construct a future school and house of worship by Merkaz Hatorah Community Kolel at 9080 W. Pico Blvd.
