The South Robertson Neighborhoods Council is requesting a traffic study be performed for a possible "No right turn on red" on eastbound Airdrome Street, at the southwest corner of Airdrome and La Cienega.

Due to the curvature of La Cienega Boulevard as it crosses Airdrome Street southbound, it is not possible to see southbound traffic when a vehicle is stopped at the traffic light on eastbound Airdrome Street.

It becomes particularly dangerous during the rush hour traffic when the parking lane of southbound La Cienega becomes a travel lane. Vehicles wanting to turn right on to La Cienega when the light is red have to move into the travel lane blinded to oncoming traffic.

Dear DONE and BONC,

In light of the requirement that Neighborhood Council (NC) board members take and pass the city's Anti-Bias testing module, we urge you to immediately address and fix inherent problems with the training and the manner in which it is being implemented.

In recent years we have seen outrageous and vitriolic behavior at NC meetings, often disparaging or demeaning or addressing with vulgar profanity directed toward NC board members based on ethnicity or gender or other protected class. Much of it came from members of the public during comment periods, but there were also many instances of biased comments and behavior from board members. We universally abhor such behavior and are pleased that BONC and DONE seem to feel the same way. However, the current Anti-Bias training is a misguided means of addressing the issue.

- 1 NC board members are elected officials of the NC system, which is established by Article 9 of the Los Angeles City Charter. Under the California Constitution, Article XX, Section 3, it is illegal to impose a test requirement on elected officials. After providing text for an oath of office, the Constitution clearly states: "And no other oath, declaration, or test, shall be required as a qualification for any public office or employment." It is therefore alarming that our right to serve and to vote is threatened on the basis of testing, as stated in the March 1, 2024 email announcing the new training requirements.
- 2 We believe that the training itself has defects. It relies heavily on Implicit Association Tests (IAT). For many of us that type of testing became famous almost 20 years ago when it was discussed in the bestseller "Blink." But anyone who read "Blink" learned more about that testing than the Anti-Bias training teaches, including the effect of information that the test subject is exposed to before taking the test, and the fact that test results can vary greatly, over time and even on the same day, for a test subject. The training described IAT testing merely as



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a means of static evaluation. Further, the means of testing through the presentation of arbitrary and unnatural associations is inherently suspect, as well as the counting of milliseconds to indicate bias when it may merely reflect the fact that the subject has been given impossible choices.

While the topic is interesting and important, we believe that participants could learn more by reading "Blink" (the LA public library has print and audiobook copies available) than by means of the current training.

3 – In the training, participants are offered a link to do their own IAT testing, with numerous alternative versions focused on different possible biases. As an NC in an area with a large Jewish population we are distressed to see that there is no testing of antisemitic bias. This is alarming at a time when antisemitic rhetoric and violence are growing and outpacing any other form of bias expression or crime. In our neighborhood two Jewish people were recently shot merely because they appeared to be Jewish, and there have been incidences of attempted car ramming, obscene speech aimed at young children, antisemitic graffiti and defacing of Jewish images.

We recognize that bias exists, and it would be a violation of our mission if we were to ignore the awful and sometimes terrifying antisemitic bias which has been acted out directly against our stakeholders. Nobody should ignore the alarming rise in antisemitism – but the training does.

We are also concerned about the prospect of disparate enforcement. As mentioned above, we have witnessed demeaning and even harassing behavior by board members, and in most instances there were DONE employees present at those meetings, yet no action was taken at any time, during or after the meeting. The offending members were never reprimanded or disciplined or even informed of their biased and unethical behavior.

We support the objective of a harassment-free NC and feel strongly that this goal cannot be achieved when standards are subject to be applied with bias. While good training is a valuable tool, we do not support any limitation of our voting or service due to unconstitutional testing requirements.
