**Aggravated Assault**

May 23, 2023, at 1130 hours, on the 2900 block of Robertson. The suspect approached the victim and asked his name. When the victim answered, the suspect lifted his shirt and brandished a handgun. The suspect then left the area.

May 26, 2023, at 1530 hours, at Helms and Venice. This incident involved domestic violence and no further detail will be given.

**Robbery**

### **Additional**

To address this issue effectively, I encourage you to follow proper procedures when disposing of furniture. Here are some suggestions to ensure responsible disposal:
