In February, our nation commemorates the invaluable contributions of Black Americans throughout history. As a proud Black American officer, I am eager to honor the trailblazers who paved the way before me on this department.

I would like to acknowledge, Homer Broome, who broke barriers by joining the LAPD in 1954. His remarkable journey led him to become the department's first Black Captain in 1969 and its first Black Commander in 1975. Today, the LAPD's Southwest Division proudly bears his name as the "Homer F. Broome Southwest Division Station." Additionally, he authored "LAPD's Black History - 1886 to 1976."



Additionally, I would also like to acknowledge the groundbreaking achievements of Georgia Ann Robinson. As the first Black American woman appointed as a police officer at the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) in 1916, she also holds the distinction of being one of the earliest Black policewomen hired in the nation.
